



# STUDENT Learning *Objective*

## SLO

Writing student learning objectives can feel like a complicated task. These are created based on your personal, grade level, or district goal and your expectations for student progress. SLOs are tailored to your class and are very individualized. Some things to consider before selecting a skill for your SLO: What is a district goal? What is a grade level goal? Based on assessments, which skill needs to be addressed? Which skill/concept appears to be the most difficult for students to grasp?

### **SLO documentation should include:**

- Identifying a skill to improve
- Composing a focus statement
- Noting the corresponding TEKS, or skills
- Determining what various levels of students can do, should be able to do, and will be able to do
- Creating a guide for growth that includes differentiation, strategies to monitor progress, and a plan for collaborating with other professionals

The examples included are generic and meant to guide you in creating your own goal. Keep in mind that each principal, or approver, will have different expectations in how these are written. They may have specific verbiage or want it to be more or less detailed. I've included two sample SLOs to get you started. Both are related to writing, 4th grade and 6th grade; however, they can be easily modified for any grade or subject. There is space for you to create your own if you download the file.

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web the fuel management module includes the high pressure fuel pump wiring and the fuel filter module the air management module identifies the crankcase breather breather filter turbocharger boost control solenoid intake manifold and the egr cooler
