Astrid: Hmm. Yes there is a time when I disappoint one of my classmates and that is my horrible nightmare. Actually she is my friend and at that time she was doing a research paper for me but I forgot to do it and then she was very angry with me.

Counselor: What do you mean that was your horrible nightmare? When she got mad at you Astrid can I know what she did and said to you?

Astrid: Hmm, Actually at that time I was very fat and my friends were few because others were ashamed of my physical appearance. When that friend of mine got angry she always called me a pig and every time she saw me she would tell me "oink oink" and then one time she painted a picture of me with my face on the pig and spread it all over the school.
