<p>Discussion Topic</p> <p>Today's discussion topic is dealing with sobriety, as part of substance abuse therapy. Clients are encouraged to talk about their experiences so far, and how no alcohol is affecting their day to day.</p>

<p>The session began with introductions, and then with sharing experiences, if comfortable.</p> <p>The clients were then lead through multiple thought exercises considering how life trajectories, relationships, impulses, self-esteem, and work has/has not been affected by their alcohol decisions. This lead to interesting insight, more personal anecdotes and group support, as well as some questions.</p> <p>The final part of the session involved goal-setting, where clients were encouraged to set goals to achieve within the next month. Small steps are recommended, and each client is expected to report back within the next session.</p>
