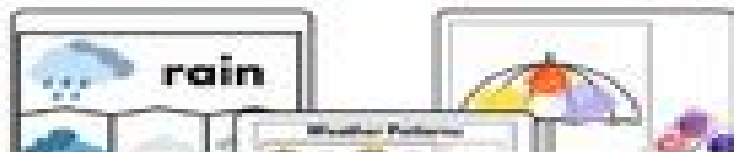
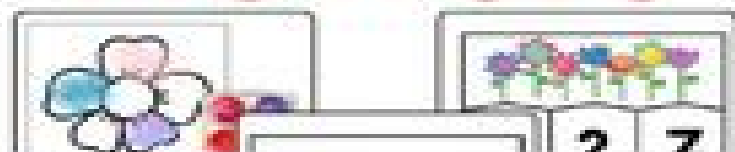

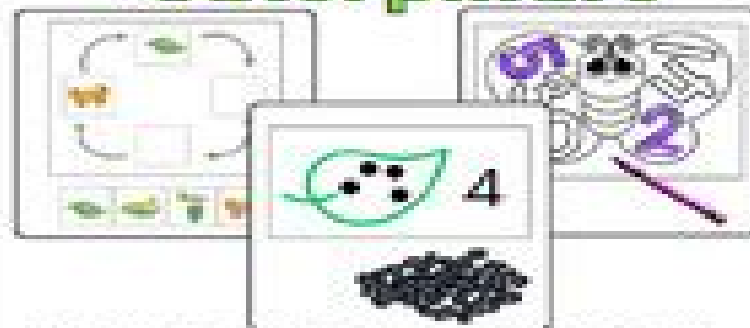

Being Fair with Kids Jim Dueck, 2020-02-10 The current practice of having children begin school within a twelve month cohort is unfair but can be ameliorated by incorporating a dual entry system Such a reform effort will dramatically reduce failure improve student achievement at all levels while reducing expenditures Many students are penalized from maximizing their academic potential simply by being born at the
