Instructions and scoring

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The REACH is a 23-item measure of childhood emotional abuse that encompasses a range of types of emotional abuse. In addition, it yields two sub-scales: a threat sub-scale which measures behaviours that can are likely to cause fear or fright, and a devaluing subscale that describes behaviours likely to engender the impression that a child is 'lesser than', disliked or worthless. It also yields a total score. The REACH is free to use, provided that a statement of copyright is included in any output.

Instructions: Thinking about your childhood, to what extent did a parent, step parent or carer in your family behave in the following way towards you. Rate your response on a scale of 1 -7, where 1 = never and 5 = a great deal.
