In his text, Michael Doyle draws upon three major factors which contribute to a liberal peacefulness: "constitutional, international or cosmopolitan sources." Democratic peace is the one in which aggressive interests of monarchies have been suppressed and individual interests of people are valued. Liberal states still have a certain desire for power; however, the benefits of peaceful coexistence between liberal states outweigh the benefits of war.

Firstly, according to Kant, the key factor is that a liberal republican state has to take into account the opinion of its citizens for whom a war would be disastrous. Consequently, the decision to start a war will be weighted with caution as the citizens will have to suffer such calamities as: "having to fight,... having painfully to repair the devastation war leaves behind...". In the case of non-liberal states the ruler who personally does not have to sacrifice anything as a result of war decides on starting a war or not, the decision to start a war is taken more easily. As a result, international policy of liberal states is characterized by caution.

Secondly, in terms of international law, liberal states recognize themselves as being just and are willing to cooperate with similar just states as a guarantee of mutual respect. As a result of free information exchange about the political life of foreign countries, liberal republics presume that foreign liberal states are also consensual, just and deserve accommodation. Liberal states recognize other liberal states as sharing similar political interests and, therefore, are willing to engage in respectful coexistence with one another.

Finally, the cosmopolitan law stresses the importance of commerce in the relationship between states. Countries are engaged in certain economic ties
