Congress s structure rules or procedures In contrast at the state level they have had ample opportunities over the course of more than two centuries to shape their state legislatures The data examined here look at how people have voted on more than 1 500 state ballot propositions targeting a wide array of legislative organizational and parliamentary features By linking the votes on these measures with the public debates preceding them this study documents not only how American viewed various aspects of their legislatures but also whether their opinions held constant or shifted over time The findings reported paint a more nuanced picture of Americans attitudes toward legislatures than the prevailing one derived from survey research When presented with legislative reform measures on which concrete choices were offered and decisions on them had to be made the analyses presented here reveal that counter to the conventional wisdom that people loved their representatives but hated the legislature voters usually took charitable positions toward the institution while harboring skeptical attitudes about lawmakers motives and behaviors **Gender and the American Presidency** Theodore F.
