skills and knowledge needed for employment The social world of young people raises fresh demands hopes and fears A global recession has affected young people disproportionately making quality of life and self fulfilment ever more difficult to attain In addressing learning and the learners first and foremost the book will argue for a wider vision of learning and a more varied pattern of provision Old structures must give way to new
