Also remember that any form of plagiarism, large or small, will not be accepted. If you do not follow all the directions listed, you will not earn any of the extra credit.

1. **Mongols:** Group of nomadic peoples united under Genghis Khan that formed an empire spanning from China to Europe.
2. **Mayan:** Indigenous people of Central America in the Yucatan peninsula, lived in Greek like city-states
3. **Aztec (Mexico):** Nomadic people that moved north and conquered and established their capital in now Mexico City.
4. **Inca:** Centralized people in the Andes that created an extensive road system.
5. **Incan Roads:** Incan roads connected the empire with an extensive system of advanced roads.
6. **Armenian Christians:** This is the first state to adopt Christianity as the official state religion and would eventually turn Coptic.
7. **Abbasid caliphate:** The Third caliphate to succeed Muhammad ruled by his dynasty.
8. **Ottoman Turks:** A Nomadic Turkish people who conquered the Byzantine empire and established their own conquering lands in Asia, Africa and Europe.
9. **Holy Roman Empire:** A collection of kingdoms, duchies, counties and other sorts that were governed by a single religious authority given to the emperor voted by electors.
10. **Song Dynasty:** A Chinese dynasty that would see the highest point China reaches in this period.
11. **Swahili city-states:** Trading cities established to trade with the Arabs and Indians, Swahili actually is a combination of African languages and Arabic.
12. **Mali Empire:** Islamic empire in West Africa that spread Islam and produced so much gold it crashed its value in the middle east.
13. **Crusades:** A series of military conflicts where European kings attempted to retake Jerusalem from Muslim rule in the name of the pope.
14. **Silk Road Trade:** The trade of luxury goods across the silk road increased drastically as a result of the Mongols and led to the diffusion of culture, religion and technology from east to west.
15. **Indian Ocean Trade:** Trade here was kickstarted by Zheng He and his massive Chinese fleet that led to large maritime trade in the Indian ocean however the Chinese would withdraw from this trade not soon after.
16. **Trans-Saharan Trade:** Trade across the Sahara was mostly in Gold, Salt, Ivory and Slaves from Africa to the Arab world.
17. **Atlantic Ocean Trade:** Europeans would produce raw products in the new world colonies, ship them to Europe to be manufactured, sell the goods in Africa and buy slaves there to sell in the new world for labor.
18. **Caravanserais:** Stops along trade routes that provided traders with a place to stock up and sleep.
19. **Monsoon winds:** Knowledge of these winds allowed sailors in the Indian ocean to navigate the ocean very effectively without destroying their ship in Monsoon storms.
20. **Development of banking:** This allowed for ease for financial processes to become far easier facilitating trade.
21. **Joint-stock Companies:** Created by the Dutch, people could give some of their money to a company to share it with others, when that company did well the owner of the stock made money.
22. **Columbian Exchange:** The exchange of culture, religion, plants, animals and disease that occurred after Columbus discovered the new world.
