

### Number

...or **NUMB**, for the correct order of operations, take care when using a calculator.

- Brackets
- Orders (or powers)
- Division and Multiplication
- Addition and Subtraction

### Types of number

**Integer:** a 'whole' number  
Factors: the divisors of an integer  
• Factors of 12 are 1, 2, 3, 4, 6, 12  
Multiples: a 'times table' for an integer (with infinite multiples)  
• Multiples of 12 are 12, 24, 36, ...  
Prime numbers: an integer which has exactly two factors (1 and the number itself). Note it is not a prime number.

### Units

**Highest Common Factor (HCF)**  
• Factors of 6 are 1, 2, 3, 6  
Factors of 9 are 1, 3, 9  
HCF of 6 and 9 is 3

### Lowest Common Multiple (LCM)

• Multiples of 6 are 6, 12, 18, 24, ...  
Multiples of 9 are 9, 18, 27, 36, ...  
LCM of 6 and 9 is 18

### Power notation

Write a number as a product of its prime factors, and follow for repeated factors.  
•  $120 = 2 \times 2 \times 2 \times 3 \times 5$

### Indices and roots

Special indices for any value  $a$   
 $a^0 = 1$   
 $a^{-1} = \frac{1}{a}$   
 $a^{\frac{1}{2}} = \sqrt{a}$

### Ordering with fractions

Adding or subtracting fractions, use a common denominator.  
•  $\frac{1}{2} + \frac{1}{3} = \frac{3}{6} + \frac{2}{6} = \frac{5}{6}$

### Multiplying fractions

Multiplying fractions: multiply numerators and denominators.  
•  $\frac{1}{2} \times \frac{1}{3} = \frac{1 \times 1}{2 \times 3} = \frac{1}{6}$

### Working fractions 'top' the second fraction

Working fractions 'top' the second fraction, then multiply.  
•  $\frac{1}{2} \div \frac{1}{3} = \frac{1}{2} \times \frac{3}{1} = \frac{3}{2}$

### Problems involving

Problems involving:  $\frac{a}{b} \div \frac{c}{d} = \frac{a}{b} \times \frac{d}{c}$   
•  $\frac{1}{2} \div \frac{1}{3} = \frac{1}{2} \times \frac{3}{1} = \frac{3}{2}$

### Least of the most frequently used ones

1	2	3	4	5	6	7	8	9	10
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### Algebra

Look for the biggest square number factor of the coefficient.  
•  $12x^2 = 4 \times 3 \times x^2 = 4x^2 \times 3x^2$

### Standard form

Standard form numbers are of the form:  $a \times 10^n$  where  $1 \leq a < 10$  and  $n$  is an integer.

### Scientific notation

1 metre = 1000 millimetres  
1 kilometre = 1000 metres  
1 metre = 100 centimetres  
1000 millimetres = 1000 millimetres  
1 centimetre = 10 millimetres

### Time

1 day = 24 hours  
1 hour = 60 minutes = 3600 seconds  
1 minute = 60 seconds

### Area and perimeter

Calculate the perimeter, then use it to 'double' (if) to find area or length.  
Perimeter (units) = the distance round  
• Length (units) = 10 units  
• Width (units) = 5 units

### Area and perimeter

Find the area of rectangles that will equal to a given value.  
•  $a = 5$  (20 divided by 4)
