However from a social constructivist, philosophical paradigm perspective, obesity is seen as a socially constructed illness, which is something quite different entirely (Blackburn, 2005, pp.158, 342). Indeed according to the Political Scientist Oliver, a social constructivist, philosophical paradigm, tends to envisage heath concerns, such as obesity within a social context, so as to fully understand and identify the health issue concerned (Oliver, 2006, pp. 611-626) (Haralamobos, Holborn, 1991, pp. 2-5, 19, 758-761, 768, 799-804).
