From the remaining apples he randomly selects and eats another apple. If the probability that both of the selected apples were red is  $\frac{a}{b}$  what is the value of  $a + b$ ?
6. What will be the remainder when  $2^{2020} - 1$  is divided by 7?
7. Josh went to the store with a number of dollars between 50 and 100, both inclusive. He spent a third of his money on lunch. He then tipped 15 dollars. After that, he deposited two-thirds of his remaining money in his bank account. After that, he donated a fifth of his remaining money to charity. He was then left with an integer number of dollars. How many dollars did he have at the beginning?
