Paper Conservation and Restoration Louise Loudon, 1978 *The Restoration of Engravings, Drawings, Books, and Other Works on Paper* Max Schweidler, 2006 Ever since its original publication in Germany in 1938 Max Schweidler's *Die Instandsetzung von Kupferstichen Zeichnungen Buchern usw* has been recognized as a seminal modern text on the conservation and restoration of works on paper To address what he saw as a woeful dearth of relevant literature and in order to assist those who have set themselves the goal of preserving cultural treasures the noted German restorer composed a thorough technical manual covering a wide range of specific techniques including detailed instructions on how to execute structural repairs and alterations that if skilfully done can be virtually undetectable By the mid twentieth century curators and conservators of graphic arts discovering a nearly invisible repair in an old master print or drawing might comment that the object had been Schweidlerized This volume based on the authoritative revised German edition of 1949 makes Schweidler's work available in English for the first time in a meticulously edited and annotated critical edition The editor's introduction places the work in its historical context and probes the philosophical issues the book raises while some two hundred annotated
