I throw a ball up in the air I expect that it will hit the ground Another example could be if I follow a specific diet and a specific exercise to lose weight then the result will be what I expected which is weight loss unless there are some other contributing factors From my epistemological standpoint I believe that reality can be captured by senses and can be predicted by experience I believe that there is no knowledge without experience To illustrate if someone says an apple is red I can't imagine what the apple looks like if I have never seen a red one before How can one know what something tastes like if they have never tasted it Experience is anything that came across our mind at any certain time in the past I also believe that knowledge can be gained through reasoning According to wisdom in my culture The reason is known the surprise is blown In other words knowledge needs clarifications and explanation so only reasoning can transform sensory data into something meaningful and understandable
