Social stratification

- The term social stratification refers to the division of the society in to layers or strate whose occupants have unequal access to social opportunities and rewards.
- People in or near the top strata enjoy privilege that are not available to the lower members of the strata
- People in the bottom strata face obstacles that other member (top) of society escape from
- In a stratified society, social inequality is institutionalized: it is a part of social structure and is
 passed from one generation to another
- Oxford dictionary of sociology "the term stratification in sociology is usually applied to studies
 of structured social inequality i.e. studies of any systematic inequality between groups of people
 which arise as the unintended consequences of social process and relationship"

Characteristics

- Social stratification is based on inequality where certain individuals and groups exercise more influence, command greater respect, and have greater access to goods and services than others do
- There is hierarchy or strata as it refers to system of division of society into different layers and create social hierarchy
- It is universal process as it takes in every kind of society and it is passed from one generation to another
- It is based on individual performance and role based status

Origin

Social stratification dates back to the emergence of agrarian state. Hunters gathered and horticulturalists had no concept of private property rather the ylived in the land which belonged to everyone. Institutionalized inequality was a consequence of agrarian revolution, which led to surplus food and other groups, a division of labors, the emergence of cities, rise of elites who didn't have to work but had the power to control the distribution of goods, centralized government. In this way the concept of stratification emerged in the society and inequality got institutionalized.

Forms of social stratification

- Open system: in it the status is achieved: a person's position in the social hierarchy is a warded on the basis of ability and effort.
- Closed system: a person's position in the social hierarchy is ascribed; people are assigned more
 or less permanent social status on the basis of traits over which they have no control. Social
 position is hereditary and individual effort and ability do not count.
