- 1 a The photo shows the flea 50 times bigger than it really is.
  - **b** 5 / 50 = 0.1 cm or 1 mm
- 2 5 × 5 = ×25; 5 × 15 = ×75; 5 × 20 = ×100
  - 3 Bacterium = 8 mm long. Dividing 8 by 0.002 gives magnification of 4000. (Answers may vary, depending on accuracy of students' measurements.)
- 4 He could see points that were at least 0.002 mm apart as separate points, but points that were closer than this appeared as a single point.
- 5 They have a greater magnification and they have a greater resolution.
- 6 0.0000002 mm = 0.0002 µm or 0.2 nm or 200 pm
- \$1 Students should spot at least one similarity (e.g. they both have a barrel containing two lenses, they both have a focusing wheel, they both need a light source) and one difference (e.g. today's microscopes have bigger magnifications, have greater resolutions, are not made of the same materials). The essential point for students to understand is that greater magnifications and greater resolutions now allow us to examine things with much greater clarity and detail.
- E1 The points around the edges of a diatom are at minimum 20 μm or 0.02 mm away from each other and so can be seen with a microscope that has a resolution down to 0.0014 mm (1.4 μm). However the pores are only 1 μm (0.001 mm) in diameter and so cannot be seen with a microscope of this resolution.
