Overview

During the Age of Discovery in the 1500s, explorers ventured forth seeking gold, jewels, and spices. Portuguese sailor Vasco da Gama reached India by navigating around Africa in 1497. Ferdinand Magellan, another Portuguese explorer, proved the Earth's roundness by completing the first circumnavigation of the globe, traveling westward. Spanish explorer Balboa crossed Central America and discovered the Pacific Ocean, which he called the South Sea. Meanwhile, John Cabot, an English navigator, sailed across the Atlantic and landed on the coast of North America. These explorers significantly expanded global knowledge, paving the way for future exploration and trade.
