

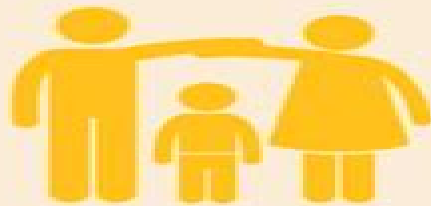
Parenting Styles

Affectionate, responsive and low in conflict, but still has demands and boundaries. Guides and regulates child.

Abstract: The development of children's social skills largely depends on the parenting style parents used in upbringing their children. Several studies have revealed that the social skills of children are influenced by the parenting style used by their parents. However, these studies were not carried out in Nigeria, especially Ibadan North Local Government Area. Research studies in Nigeria focused on parenting style and children's cognitive development, neglecting how the parenting styles affect social skills of children. This study therefore investigates the influence of parenting style on the social skills of pupils in lower primary classes in Ibadan North Local Government Area, Oyo State. The following are the research questions this study sought to answer:

1. What is the composite contribution of parenting styles on the social skills of pupils in lower primary classes in Ibadan North Local Government Area of Oyo State?
2. What is the relative contribution of parenting style on the social skills of pupils in lower primary classes in Ibadan North Local Government Area of Oyo State?
3. What is the most dominant parenting style used by parents of pupils in lower primary classes in Ibadan North Local Government Area, Oyo State?
