Mahoney, 2015-01-06 103 pages with sixty four different writing activities to guide your students in using antonyms to describe a person place or thing Each page has an incredible photo taken by me out on local trails like a honeybee on a flower a hovering hummingbird a lizard on a log a gnarly tree a buckhorn cholla cactus an Apache plume flower a painted lady butterfly a grasshopper a mushroom a barrel cactus a monarch caterpillar a bee on a thorn a shield bug a spider a bunny an empty snail shell a mother lynx spider protecting her babies a male mountain goat a water drop and so forty five more In the first two sections students create their own sentences using a pair of antonyms Each page has a sample pair of antonyms based on one of my photos like these A fast bee calmly lands on a flower while a slow beetle flies away in panic Or A hungry hummingbird hovers below a flower full of nectar as a curious blue jay stares at it from below Or A thin lizard sits silently on a thick log while a hungry hawk screeches loudly in the skies overhead Twelve pages in section one with lots of support Twenty pages in section two with less support and room for more creativity In the third section students have thirty two opportunities to write a story based on a photo and its prompt inserting three pairs of antonyms into each story Thirty two photos Thirty two prompts Here are a few of the prompts a rabbit that was scared of the rain a flower that wanted to be a tree a snail that ran away a cactus that didn't want to hurt others a lonely tree that missed its leaves a bench that didn't like to be sat on a mountain goat that liked to fight a fish trapped in a cold creek two trees that argued every day and twenty three more Perfect for whole class instruction or a literacy center Use it for your Gifted students or early finishers Send it with them for homework Common Core Standards ELA 4 L 5b and 5 L 5a and 5 RL 4 Timothy V.
