Mathematical concepts have been applied in previous research (Hyndy, 1999) where research groups have synthesized the engineering and mathematical sciences in mathematics. I believe that ISE should provide opportunities to expand on the knowledge I was introduced to as a child. I am excited to be able present to that learning system as the E Symposium on Industrial and Systems Engineering through the integration of the academic knowledge and my personal/communitary values as shown in my interdisciplinary research.
