Academic institutions are value driven hence virtually every decision made by an academic administrator has an ethical component with implications for students, faculty, the institution and the broader community. Despite this they receive little systematic preparation for this aspect of their professional lives when they take up administrative posts especially when compared to say medical or legal training. Surprisingly little has been written about the ethical challenges that academic administrators are likely to face. Most of the literature relating to academic administration focuses on leadership and draws heavily on management and social science theory.
