FORM	EXAMPLE	USAGE
Simple Present	I <u>play</u> tennis.	Habitual or repeated actions.
Present Continuous	I <u>am playing</u> tennis.	Actions happening right now.
Present Perfect	I <u>have played</u> tennis.	Actions that began in the past and continue to the present.
Present Perfect Continuous	I <u>have been playing</u> tennis.	Actions that began in the past and continue up to the present moment.
