Purpose:

 Individually-administered articulation inventory for children 3-8 years of age.

Provides:

 Measurement of articulation through naming pictures and repeating stimulus words. Voice quality, language use, fluency, and intelligibility are assessed through the test's final items which require the child to verbalize a "story" around stimulus pictures.

Standardization Issues:

 The test's norms were based on 800 children from 24 states, and included children identified with speech-language disabilities. Purportedly, the demographics for the norm sample closely matched US demographics for that time period.

Reliability and Validity Issues:

 Internal consistency estimates for each age-level yielded acceptable reliability results. Examples of content-, criterion-, concurrent-, and construct-validity evidence are cited in the manual and appear sufficient to support its use as an articulation inventory.

Additional Points:

- The authors' statistical analysis for item bias on the basis of gender, race (White/Non-White), and ethnicity (Hispanic/Non-Hispanic) suggested no evidence of bias.
- No data on interrater reliability is reported, however, interscorer reliability (based on 2 scorers independently scoring 20 already-completed protocols) showed a high degree of scoring consistency.
- The test does not provide any specific framework for remedial activities, which lies in the hands of skilled clinicians to develop.
- Item discrimination analysis of the total (standardization) sample suggested that most children made less than 10% errors, suggesting that the test may not be especially sensitive to discriminating variable-degrees of development.
- The test is not normed for dialectical speakers, so care must be taken in interpreting results from children whose language contains natural
