

# PLOT ELEMENTS

The **plot** of a story is the series of events that make up a story.

There are five plot elements in a story.

## Climax:

- the turning point of the story
- usually the most exciting or surprising part of the story

## Rising Action:

- the main parts of the story which includes the problem
- Usually set up as 3 – 4 main events

## Falling Action:

- the events that follow the climax
- leads to the resolution

## Exposition:

- occurs at the beginning
- introduces the main character, setting, and basic situation needed to understand the story

## Resolution:

- the end of the story where all the loose ends are tied up
