Day Four Lesson Plans:

Objective: Students will be able to identify, apply, grade-level phonics skills to identify the short a sound from auditory and visual cues and read words that contain the short a sound.

Materials: Pencils, paper, and any materials you need to complete these activities.

Whole Class: Go over the Read, Find, and Color from yesterday and practice the answers to improve fluency. Let students pair up and check their own work together. Students can take turns reading a sentence and sharing the words they highlighted/circled. Ask them what clues helped them identify the short A words. After you are done, send them off to their independent work.

Independent Work: Today's activity is writing. Challenge students to use as many short A words as possible in a passage. Display the cards to help them.

Read, Find, and Color

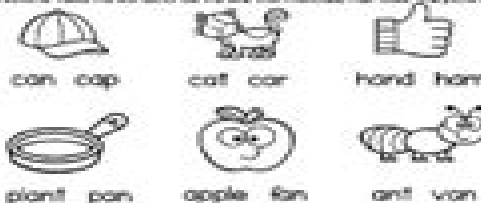
