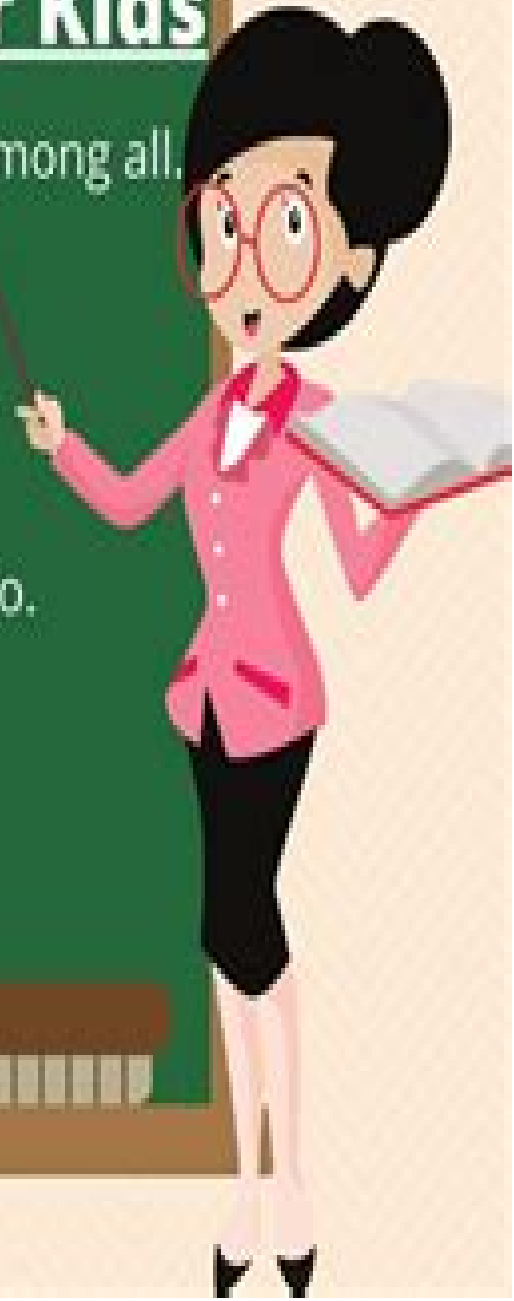


My Favourite Teacher Essay for Kids
