On the other hand, nurse promote professional role development and growth from nursing novice to expert, help mitigate errors, simplify processes, and identify opportunities to improve processes and mitigate risks to the patient, nurse, and hospital (Walsh University, 2019). In contrast to, a nurse supervisor is responsible for managing staff, overseeing patient care and ensuring adherence to established policies and procedures (Thomson, 2020).
