Alliteration	A string of words that all start with the same letter and sound. Example: Betty Bottler bought the bottle.
Almanac	A book of maps.
Anecdote	A short story, often used to show an example.
Autobiography	A non-fiction book that a person writes about their own life.
Assume / Assumption	To think/ say that you know something even if you don't actually know it or don't have proof. Example: I didn't see him do it, but I assume that John took it because he's taken things before.
Book review	writing that tells someone's opinion about a book.
Caption	The writing underneath a picture or other graphic, explaining it.
Chronological	Going in order of time, first first (early) to last (later).
Conflict	A problem or difficulty.
Contradict	Go against or disagree with.
Conversation	An exchange between 2+ people with the people taking turns speaking.
Diary	Personal writing meant for only the writer to read.
Drama	Serious, emotional type of writing.
Fact	A true piece of information.
